Why does USDA want Animal ID?

To establish the foundation for an animal information system necessary to support our animal disease control, eradication, monitoring and surveillance programs.







GOAL

The goal of the National Animal Identification System is to have the capability to identify all animals and premises that had direct contact with a foreign animal disease (FAD) within <u>48 hours</u> after discovery.





Key components are standards:

- A uniform premises identification system;
- A uniform and nationally recognized individual animal numbering system;
- A uniform and nationally recognized numbering system for groups or lots of animals.







Premises Identification


- 1st priority to establish the national premises system in 2004.
- Why is premises identification so important? ... a "must have" to track livestock movements.

















Standard: US Premises Identification Number

- Unique number entire United States
- Format
 - 7 characters
 - Example: A23T567

Right most character is a check digit

Standard: Individual Animal Identification

Country Code (3 numeric) 840 = USA
12 digit animal number

Example: 840 002 134 567 892

Group/Lot of Animals

Identifying a Group or Lot of is applicable when the entire group moves through the production chain as one unit.

Standard #3 Group/Lot Identification Number (page 16)

Example: A23T567 (103002)

□ USDA-APHIS administers the allocation of US Animal Identification Numbers to certified USAIN Managers.

The USAIN Manager will first apply to the USDA/APHIS for a Participant Number.

USAIN Managers access the Premises Repository to validate the reported premises number

Current Status and Initial Implementation Steps

 \$18.8 million now transferred from USDA's Commodity Credit Corporation to fund the development and implementation of an animal identification system.





Current Status and Initial Implementation Steps

- Implementation to start on a voluntary basis
- Eventual requirements for premises and animal identification as we learn more during the development and implementation of the system.







Priorities for 2004

 Inform producers, marketers and processors on premises and livestock number systems, technologies needed, and other aspects of the program.





Priorities for 2004

Ongoing efforts of Species Working Groups

- Several groups now functioning.
- Identify production practices, obstacles, and issues that may impact animal ID for their species.
- Provide appropriate solutions which support and direct the implementation of animal ID in their species.







Priorities for 2004

- Identify premises with national standard
- Initial role out August 2004
- All States operational mid year 2005





Priorities for 2004

- Fund cooperative agreements to assist with initial implementation.
 - 29 projects funded
 - All include premises registration
 - Some also include "field trial" components





Priorities for 2004

 Identify and qualify third parties, such as private industry and trade associations that have ID products or programs, so they could be integrated in the national system.
